Perelman, Barkin wed

Cosmetics king Ronald Perelman wed for the fourth time last night, taking Bronx-born actress Ellen Barkin as his bride in a traditional Jewish ceremony at an upper East Side synagogue.

"Sea of Love" star swapped vows under a chupah — the canopy used at Jewish weddings — and the groom broke a wine glass with his foot, symbolizing how fragile life

Barkin, 46, and Perelman, 57, made it to the Fifth Ave. Synagogue and their celebrity guests minutes before the 6 p.m. cere-

Perelman walked to the temple from his townhouse a block away. He sported a wide smile and a blue suit with a blue tie that had yellow and green stripes.

Barkin showed up moments later, wearing a form-fitting knee-length skirt suit in a pink, blue and white floral pattern.

The 45 wedding guests arrived in limousines, Mercedes-Benzes and luxury sportutility vehicles. The crowd included actress/director Penny Marshall and Trudie Styler, the wife of rock star Sting.

Asked if she had a message for the newlyweds, Styler, decked out in a blue Versace suit, said, "I believe *l'chaim* is appropriate, and a happy and wonderful mar-

Marshall said she had one word for the

After the 45-minute service, the couple emerged from the synagogue — Barkin flashing her famed lopsided grin as her second husband wrapped his arm around her shoulder.

"It was a very beautiful and touching ceremony," said Gabriel Byrne, Barkin's first husband and the father of her children, Romy Marion, 8, and Jack, 11. "I wished them every joy and every happiness.

Barkin's mother, Evelyn, gushed, "It was just beautiful, very lovely. It was just a proper, traditional Hebrew service. The whole family was under the *chupah*. They are a wonderful couple. Good, kind, lov-

The guests followed the newlyweds to a private third-floor room at Le Cirque 2000, where mazel toys echoed into the night and the meal included a 1993 Cristal champagne, roast chicken and Chilean sea

Taking a break from the festivities, Barkin sneaked a cigarette and sipped on a glass of vodka in the rest room

But last night, Caleigh appeared happy as she rode on the shoulders of another guest.

Altogether, Perelman has six children from his three previous marriages.

The party broke up just after 11 p.m., with Barkin and Perelman cramming into the back seat of a Mercedes with several pals. Asked what their plans were, Perelman replied, "To have a happy life."

Inside, Conger lies on her back on sun-baked sand and reclines languidly against a sandstone boulder - without a stitch on.
